



History of Independence Day

INDEPENDENCE DAY, IN INDIA, IS CELEBRATED AS A NATIONAL HOLIDAY, ANNUALLY ON AUGUST 15. INDEPENDENCE DAY MARKS THE END OF BRITISH RULE IN 1947 AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INDEPENDENT AND FREE INDIA.

ALSO, IT MARKS THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE PARTITION OF THE INDIAN SUBCONTINENT INTO INDIA AND PAKISTAN. WHEN THE COUNTRY WAS SEVERED ON COMMUNAL GROUNDS AND HAD WIDE BLOODSHED, MIGRATION AND VIOLENCE FOLLOWED THROUGHOUT THE NATION.

BRITISH RULE IN INDIA BEGAN AFTER THE BRITISH VICTORY AT THE BATTLE OF PLASSEY IN 1757. AND FOLLOWING THAT, THE ENGLISH EAST INDIA COMPANY BEGAN EXERCISING CONTROL OVER THE COUNTRY.

INDIA SUFFERED OPPRESSION FROM THE BRITISH COLONIZERS FOR AROUND 200 YEARS. THE EAST INDIA COMPANY RULED INDIA FOR THE FIRST CENTURY AFTER WHICH IT GOT REPLACED BY DIRECT BRITISH RULE IN THE WAKE OF THE REBELLION OF 1857.

AS THE COLONIAL RULE LED TO WIDESPREAD REVOLTS AND RESENTMENTS WITHIN THE COUNTRY. INDIAN HISTORY IS SINCE THEN MARKED BY MANY RETALIATIONS AND INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENTS THAT EVENTUALLY DROVE THE BRITISH COLONIZERS OUT OF THE COUNTRY.

THE LAST BRITISH GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA, LORD MOUNTBATTEN HAD BEEN GIVEN A MANDATE BY THE BRITISH ASSEMBLY TO TRANSFER THE POWER BY THE 30TH OF JUNE 1948. BUT HE WAS FORCED TO ADVANCE THE DATE TO AUGUST 1947. THE MEMORABLE WORDS OF SHRI C RAJAGOPALACHARI WERE, "IF HE HAD WAITED TILL JUNE 1948, THERE WOULD HAVE BEEN NO POWER LEFT TO TRANSFER".

JUSTICE 4

INTRO

"Yato Dharmastato Jaya" means "Where there is Dharma, there is victory". The Motto of the Supreme Court clearly shows that Judicial Independence is the barricading of our dynamic system.

The Indian Constitution deals with justice, freedom, equality, integrity, and dignity. The concept of justice depends on the interpretation of the constitution. The Constitution stipulates justice, namely social justice, economic justice, and legal justice, which are an integral part of the theory of distributive justice. The phenomenon of "distributive justice" is based on two important points: first, fair distribution is not only about resources and materials, but also about rights, obligations, and responsibilities; secondly, justice is a phenomenon, not only for the people, who govern but also for those who govern. People who govern themselves. Article 14 and Article 21 of the Indian Constitution respectively mention "all people are equal before the law" and "the right to live with dignity". This is the soul of constitutional governance; the constitution has the upper hand because it gives the people identity. Identity in society is everything to justice; we demand our identity, not just for justice. Many philosophers offer different concepts of justice. It cannot be said that the Constitution of India is based on one theory, but is the result of all jurisprudential theories. It requires real efforts for society, the individual, the law, the economy, and general development.

Types of Justice



SOCIAL JUSTICE



Social justice denotes the equal treatment of all citizens without any social distinction based on caste, color, race, religion, sex, and so on.





Economic justice denotes the non-discrimination between people based on economic factors. It involves the elimination of glaring inequalities in wealth, income, and property.

JUSTICE POLITICAL



Political justice means equal, free and fair opportunities for the people to participate in the political process. It stands for the grant of equal political rights to all people without discrimination.

Social Justice

The concept of social justice emerged out of a process of evolution of social norms, order, law, and morality. It emphasized just action and created space for intervention in society by enforcing rules and regulations based on the principles of social equality. The term 'social justice consists of two words: one is social and the second is justice. The term 'social' is concerned with all human beings who live in society, while the term 'justice' is related to liberty, equality, and rights. Thus, social justice is concerned with ensuring liberty, providing equality, and maintaining individual rights for every human being in society. In other words, securing the highest possible development of the capabilities of all members of the society may be called social justice.

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's name will be written in golden letters in the history of India as a champion of social justice. He was not only the main builder of the Constitution but also the crusader of social justice for the betterment of the downtrodden. He spent his whole life for the betterment of the poor and exploited untouchables in Indian society.

Economic Justice

The Constitution of India provides different fundamental rights to the peoples of India and even ascribed some duty on the part of the state under the directive principle of state policy through which it ensures economic justice to its people.

The Indian Constitution in several places provides for economic justice and equality of opportunity. The founders of the post-colonial statecraft. A constitution that envisioned a Government that would wield the majority of the economic power. They also provided mechanisms to help ensure that all the castes and classes in the country would have an opportunity to participate in the economy. Now that this economic power will be transferred to the private sector, is there any justification whether based on constitutional grounds or judicial arguments to insist that the private corporations also provide opportunities to all castes and classes of India? The upcoming situation will respond to the question as to whether by way of constitutional or judicial arguments a case can be made for the application of some sort of equality of opportunity requirement for the impending Indian Capitalist revolution and governmental approach to achieve the constitutional goal of economic justice.

Political Justice

All liberal democratic countries are based on the principle of "one man, one vote, one value" is faithfully adopted.

According to the Indian Constitution actl4: political justice involves a Universal Adult Franchise and no distinction on the grounds of religion, sex, caste, color, and the matters of holding public offices. It means giving equal political rights and opportunities to all citizens to take part in the administration of the country.

Citizens should have the right to vote without any discrimination on the basis of religion, color, caste, creed, sex, birth, or status. Every citizen should have an equal right to vote and to contest elections.

As our Indian constitution defines political justice as equal, free and fair opportunities for the people to participate in the political process. It stands for the grant of equal political rights to all people without discrimination. The Constitution of India provides for a liberal democracy in which all the people have the right and freedom to participate.



The Constitution of India recognizes Liberty, equality, and fraternity as the

principles of life that cannot be divorced from each other.

Liberty cannot be divorced from equality; equality cannot be divorced from liberty, nor can liberty and equality be divorced from fraternity.

"Equality" is one of those words that seems simple, but is more complicated upon closer inspection. At its core, equality can be defined as "the state of being equal". When societies value equality, their goals include racial, economic, and gender equality. Do we know what equality looks like in practice? Does it mean equal opportunities, equal outcomes, or both?

Equality does not mean the identity of treatment or the sameness of reward. If an auto driver gets the same reward as a doctor or a scientist, the purpose of society will be defeated. Equality, therefore, means, first of all, the absence of social privilege. In the second place, it means that adequate opportunities are laid open to all".

As equality is concerned, Gen Z is here. Currently, Gen Z is the largest generation: 32% percent of the world population belongs to those born between 1995 and 2015. Not only is Gen Z the largest generation, Gen Zers are also the most ethnically diverse and highest-educated in history.

Gen Z is in favor of gender role flexibility. Gender role flexibility could mean that boys are allowed to be emotional and girls are allowed to be strong, breaking 'traditional' role patterns. Same-sex marriage appears to be widely-accepted among Gen Z, Gen Z shares a high concern about discrimination

Gen Z is passionate about social justice. Gen Z was also the most aware that climate change disproportionately affects women.

We believe that equality is worth fighting for. It can be shown in many ways, but it is not. Society has made people believe that it is okay to treat people differently because of the way they look or by what color they are or their sexual preference. Being treated with respect is what people want and expect, but they do not always show it themselves. Equality should be shown through all people.

As said by Maya Angelou, we all should know that diversity makes for a rich tapestry, and we must understand that all the threads of the tapestry are equal in value. Equality is non negotiable.

Liberty

POINT OF LIBERTY

The term 'liberty of person' refers to freedom from the confinement of the body as a result of unlawful or arbitrary processes. In this sense, the right to liberty of person poses obligations on States to protect individuals from abduction by any criminal groups.

Why is liberty so important?

LIBERTY IN INDIAN CONSTITUTION

Article 21 provides two rights:
Right to life and Right to
personal liberty.
The right specifically mentions
that no person shall be
deprived of life and liberty
except as per the procedure
established by law. This
implies that this right has been
provided against the State.
The Supreme Court of India has
described this right as the
"Heart of fundamental right".

Liberty is precious, rare, never guaranteed, and always threatened. It can be lost in a single generation if it's not advanced and defended. Liberty and security of person are necessary for carrying out activities related to environmental protection and defence. It follows from human nature that We are unique individuals, not a blob or an army of robots to be programmed. To be fully human, all of us must be free to exercise our choices and govern our lives so long as we permit the same of others. It produces a degree of interpersonal cooperation, innovation, and wealth creation that allows human beings to flourish.
